## About Children's Scholarship Fund



## Two ways to give



### Charitable Contribution

As a 501c3 nonprofit, CSF accepts charitable gifts from individuals, foundations, and businesses for scholarships and/or general operating expenses that are deductible for federal tax purposes.



### Education Tax Credit


Any business that pays Business Profits Tax (BPT) and/or Business Enterprise Tax (BET) to New Hampshire can receive an 85% tax credit for scholarship donations to CSF through the New Hampshire Education Tax Credit Program.

## How does the tax credit program work?

**JAN 1** Businesses can submit an Education Tax Credit Application (Form ED-02) between January 1st and June 15th. The credits are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis until the cap in credits is reached.

# K-12th Grade Scholarships Available for Low- & Moderate-Income New Hampshire Students

## CSF scholarships pay for up to 75% of your child's tuition:

- at a New Hampshire independent/private school,
- at a New Hampshire public school outside of your district,
- or for homeschooling expenses

## Do I qualify?

- Eligible children must be between the ages of 5 and 20 and must not have graduated from high school.
- Your gross family income must not exceed 300% of the federal poverty level:

Family Size	2	3	4	For each add'l person, add
Income Limit	\$48,060	\$60,480	\$72,900	\$12,480

## How do I apply?

- FACTS charges a \$30 fee per family to apply. If this fee presents a barrier to your family, please contact us at: [infonh@scholarshipfund.org](mailto:infonh@scholarshipfund.org).
- Scholarships are awarded to students based on highest financial need, funds raised, and the metrics in the Education Tax Credit law. If you are awarded a scholarship, we will notify you by or before July, 2016.
